The Rules

The Reading Challenge will introduce young readers to things they can do to reduce littering, increase the use of recycling, and help to beautify and improve the natural environment around where they live and play.

1. Students entering grades K through 5th completing the Challenge will read 3 books from our [reading list](#) between August 15th and September 15th, 2020.
2. Students entering grades K through 2nd may complete the Challenge by viewing and listening to as many as 3 [Storytime with Mel](#) events that are posted on Facebook live or recorded between August 15th and September 15th, 2020.
3. Students entering 6th grade completing the Challenge will read 2 books from our [reading list](#) between August 15th and September 15th, 2020.
4. All registered readers will receive a certificate. Registered readers with a home address zip code in Nassau County, Florida will receive a certificate and upon confirming completion of the Challenge will receive a prize.
5. Readers must be registered and must have permission from a parent or guardian to participate in the Challenge.
6. Upon completion of the Challenge, readers verify they have completed the Challenge by completing a short 3 question survey about their reading experience. The survey will be available [HERE](#) on August 22nd. The Survey will not be available after September 18th.
7. A reminder email will be sent to registered Readers who have not completed the Survey on September 1st and again on September 14th.
8. Certificates and prizes will be distributed no later than September 30, 2020.
