### April 9 Wild Nite Series to Feature Manatees, Whales, and Dolphins

Fernandina Beach, Florida, March 16, 2024 - Join Keep Nassau Beautiful on Tuesday, April 9, at 7 pm, in the historic Peck Center Auditorium, Fernandina Beach, for a Wild Nite Nature Presentation with Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (aka "FWC") for an informative look at our local marine mammals and those that work with them and on their behalf.

Marine Mammal Biologist, Nadia Lentz has worked with FWC since December 2010. Her team of three works out of the Jacksonville Zoo and Gardens responding to marine mammal needs in eleven counties. Nadia will discuss the team's work to rescue, perform necropsies and autopsies, and learn more about the threats these animals face.

Come learn about our local species and the collaboration of teams working with Florida manatees, bottlenose dolphins and the critically endangered North Atlantic right whales.
